



2nd Degree Hybrid Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The Program

The 2nd Degree Hybrid program is designed to allow students with a previous bachelor's degree to complete a BSN degree while balancing work, life, and educational goals. Upon graduating from the program *and* successfully passing the NCLEX-RN, you will be qualified to begin working as a Registered Nurse.

- Part-time (10 terms) or full-time (6 terms) plans of study
- Fall or Spring admission
- All theory coursework online
- Alternate geographical in-person clinical sites possible (based on student enrollment)
- Alternate clinical schedules possible (based on clinical availability)
- Scheduled virtual testing day
- **NO entrance exam**

Admission Criteria

- A bachelor's degree (any field) from an accredited institution
- GPA \geq 2.75 on courses that count toward the BSN degree (including repeated courses)
- No more than one science course failure (pertains to BIO 234, BIO 235, BIO 260, CHE 101, AND HEA 240)
- Applicants with more than one science course failure (in the same or a combination of courses) must take the ATI TEAS pre-admission exam to demonstrate science proficiency for admission eligibility.
 - Applicants are not required to meet a minimum composite score but must achieve a science sub-score at or above the BSN program mean for the science section.
- Must complete all prerequisite courses and ten or more hours of university core requirements prior to entering the nursing program
