



Pre-licensure Bachelor of Science in Nursing

William Carey University

The Program

The pre-licensure BSN program prepares students to become Registered Nurses with enhanced critical thinking and assessment training. Upon graduating from the program *and* successfully passing the NCLEX-RN, you will be qualified to begin working as a Registered Nurse.

- Full-time, accelerated program can be completed in 18 months (6 terms)
- Fall or Spring admission
- Eligible transfer credits accepted
- **NO entrance exam**
- **Preferred Admission Program eligible**

Admission Criteria

- GPA ≥ 2.75 on courses that count toward the BSN degree (including repeated courses)
- No more than one science course failure (pertains to BIO 234, BIO 235, BIO 260, CHE 101, AND HEA 240)
- Applicants with more than one science course failure (in the same or a combination of courses) must take the ATI TEAS pre-admission exam to demonstrate science proficiency for admission eligibility.
 - Applicants are not required to meet a minimum composite score but must achieve a science sub-score at or above the BSN program mean for the science section. (See ATI TEAS info below)
- Must complete all prerequisite courses and ten or more hours of university core requirements prior to entering the nursing program

Additional Guidelines

- Hours taken at William Carey University are considered in the application process.
- General admission to William Carey University does not indicate that a student has been admitted to the nursing program, which has a separate admission process.
- Applications can be submitted to one campus only per admission cycle. Once admitted at one campus, students must complete all nursing courses on that campus (not eligible to transfer).
- Students wishing to transfer from another nursing program must provide a letter of good standing from that school of nursing and meet admission requirements equivalent to the Joseph and Nancy Fail School of Nursing.
- Only transferable courses (equivalent to the Joseph and Nancy Fail School of Nursing courses) will count in the nursing GPA. If unsuccessful in a transferable nursing course, that course will count as one nursing failure for admission and progression.

ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills)

- Offered monthly on each campus
- Non-refundable \$80 exam fee
- Exam can be taken a total of three times at 30-day intervals (regardless of exam site)
- Official TEAS exam results from designated testing sites accepted
- Requires creating account at www.atitesting.com
- Exam prep materials available at www.atitesting.com/onlinestore
- Exam content areas:
 - Reading Comprehension (45 questions/55 minutes)
 - English & Language Usage (37 questions/37 minutes)
 - Math (38 questions/57 minutes)
 - Science (50 questions/60 minutes)
